Brethren,

As we approach the festive season, I would like you to consider especially those less fortunate than ourselves. I know you always do, but I want to draw your attention to those brethren whom you may not have seen for some time, who have been absent from Lodge meetings, may be avoiding Festive Boards or who may be in arrears. In this time of inflation of food and fuel prices it would not be surprising if some of our members are struggling but who are averse to asking for help. It is an appropriate time of year to contact all such brethren, to enquire after their health and ask if they are in need of anything. Secondly, it would also not be surprising if we have members who have been waiting for long periods for medical treatment.

In both instances, the Masonic Charities exist to assist. The Masonic Charitable Foundation can be contacted direct, while an application to the Mark Benevolent Fund has to be channelled through me. The MBF usually expects an applicant to have approached the MCF, but sometimes is able to provide urgent assistance rather

If a Brother is in need but reluctant to share his problems with a member of his Lodge, I am available for advice.

Brethren, let us all do our best to ensure that the coming weeks are enjoyed as they should be by all of our members and their families.

Provincial Delegations

If you have Provincial Rank and are thinking of ways to support the Province of London, then signing up for some Provincial Delegations may be just what you are looking for.

All Active and Past Provincial Ranks are entitled to attend the Delegations supporting the Deputy and Assistant PGMs, the two active Provincial Grand Wardens and the Provincial Grand Secretary. The Provincial Grand Master also carries out Full Team Visits throughout the year, to which all Active Officers and Past Wardens are entitled to attend.

These meetings are, for the most part, scheduled for the whole season ahead and sent to eligible parties prior to the start of the new Masonic season, giving you good notice for fitting into your schedules. They are also available on the Provincial website as a download. To reduce the email load we send out these to all first appointments, all active ranks and anyone who has attended at least one delegation in the previous 2 years. A second mailing also goes out as a reminder roughly half-way through the season.

Since the Covid lockdown period attendance at Delegations has, understandably, been down. Obviously the current "Cost of Living Crisis" has meant many have had to tighten their belts and make more selective choices on their meetings. If cost is a concern, you should be aware that it is perfectly acceptable to attend a Delegation and not dine - as much as the Lodges would love to have your company at the Festive Board, we are all only too well aware of the ever increasing cost of private dining.

If you haven't tried a Delegation yet, give it a go! There are still plenty of opportunities get out and support, right up to the day before our Annual Provincial Meeting in July.


