Sitting alongside our contribution towards the success of Metropolitan Royal Arch is our support for the Metropolitan Grand Master's £3m appeal for London's Air Ambulance. London Mark is organising a sponsored cycle ride (to Brighton), where the majority of the proceeds will be directed towards that Appeal. Look out for details elsewhere in this edition of *The London Mallet*, but in essence we are also looking for riders – so dig out that Lycra all you young cyclists and get into training for this special charity fund raiser!

Currently, a few of our Lodges have been sponsoring the London Hackney Cab Drivers annual support of London's disabled children. This year they are off again to Disneyland Paris. Amongst the sponsoring Lodges are Aegean, Bon Accord, and the Installed Commanders and Masters who have each contributed £1,500 towards the costs of one cab and all the associated expenses of transport, hotels, carers etc.

Also on the charity front, one of the immediate and simplest ways individuals and Lodges can contribute to the London Mark Benevolent Fund is through the 50-50 Club. Brethren, for a mere £12 (or multiples thereof!!) you can have the chance of winning a tidy sum and at the same time making a difference to a London charity.


A Demonstration of 'BEYOND THE CRAFT' - Friday 31 March 2023
